

# Clinical Rotations and Curriculum

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## Rotation Requirements

Rotations are on a monthly basis, starting the first of each calendar month and ending the last day of the month, regardless of the number of days. Any time off a rotation will be at the discretion of the preceptor with approval of the **Department of Family Medicine**.

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## Required and Assigned Rotations

Rotation	Length of rotation
Family Medicine (Required and assigned)	two-month block
Emergency Medicine (Required and assigned)	two-month block
General Internal Medicine (Required and assigned)	two-month block
Pediatrics–Neonate (Required and assigned)	two-month block
General Surgery (Required and assigned)	two-month block
Osteopathic Principles and Practice (Required and assigned at PCSOM)	one month
Women’s Health (Required and assigned)	one month
Psychiatry (Required and assigned)	one month
Clinical Radiology and Anesthesiology (Required and assigned)	one-month/(two weeks each)
Clinical subspecialty (Neurology, Gastroenterology, Pulmonology, Cardiology, Nephrology, etc.) as available <i>rotations</i> to each core site. These are two one-month selective rotations located in the core site areas. (Required and assigned)	two one-month

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## **Elective Rotations**

There are four months of elective rotations to be selected by the student and approved by the PCSOM Chair, Department of Family Medicine. These are restricted as follows:

- One month must be a medicine elective.
- One month must be a surgery elective.
- Two months are unrestricted electives (with PCSOM approval)
